





Common weaknesses



Issue addressed (Criterion 1):

- Too broad scope / poorly described: be specific
- Not in line with priority axis
- Not reflected in policy instruments addressed and territorial contexts



What is a policy instrument?



Any **policy**, **strategy**, **or law** developed by public authorities to improve a specific territorial situation such as:

- Structural Funds programmes
 e.g. Regional operational programme of Andalucía,
 Interreg Estonia-Latvia cooperation programme
- other local, regional or national policy instruments *e.g. Waste management plan of Flanders*

key element to be identified by each partner region at the start of your application

Common weaknesses




Policy instruments (Criterion 1):

- Not precisely defined in the AF (e.g. indication of the specific priority addressed)
- Misunderstanding for Structural Funds (instrument indicated not the **Operational** / **Cooperation** programme)

organisations responsible for policy design and implementation

Core target group of Interreg Europe





Is the partner competent in the topic?

Can the partner influence the policy instrument?

What can the partner bring to the cooperation?

Other criteria:

- programme's wide geographical coverage
- partner's capacity to actively participate in project



B.2.1.2 Partner relevance for policy instrument 1

Partner



What are the partner's competences and experiences in the issue addressed by this policy? In case the partner is involved in several applications / projects, please justify this multiple involvement.



What is the capacity of the partner to influence the above policy instrument 1? (e.g. in case the partner is not the policy reponsible organisation, what are its links with this organisation? How is the partner involved in the design and implementation of the policy instrument?)



How will the partner contribute to the content of the cooperation and benefit from it? \rightarrow refer to the issue addressed

→ describe involvement in policy making process

describe partner's role in the project

Common weaknesses



Policy relevance of partners (Criterion 3):

- No direct involvement of bodies responsible for the policy instrument addressed
- No clear policy relevance of the partners involved: weak capacity to influence the policy instrument.
 Letter of support is not sufficient
- Geographical coverage limited to transnational or cross-border areas

Who else to involve?



Stakeholder groups

- Organisations concerned by policy instrument
- Ensure the interregional learning takes place at organisational and stakeholders level
- Increase the chance of achieving policy change:

key tool for driving policy change


 Group composition varies: public authorities, chambers of commerce, regional agencies, SMEs, NGOs...

Advisory partners



- Offer a particular competence that can facilitate the project's implementation (e.g. European network in charge of communication strategy)
- Do not address a policy instrument and therefore do not need to develop an action plan
- Work for the entire partnership

Participation to be **justified** in section B.1 of application form
