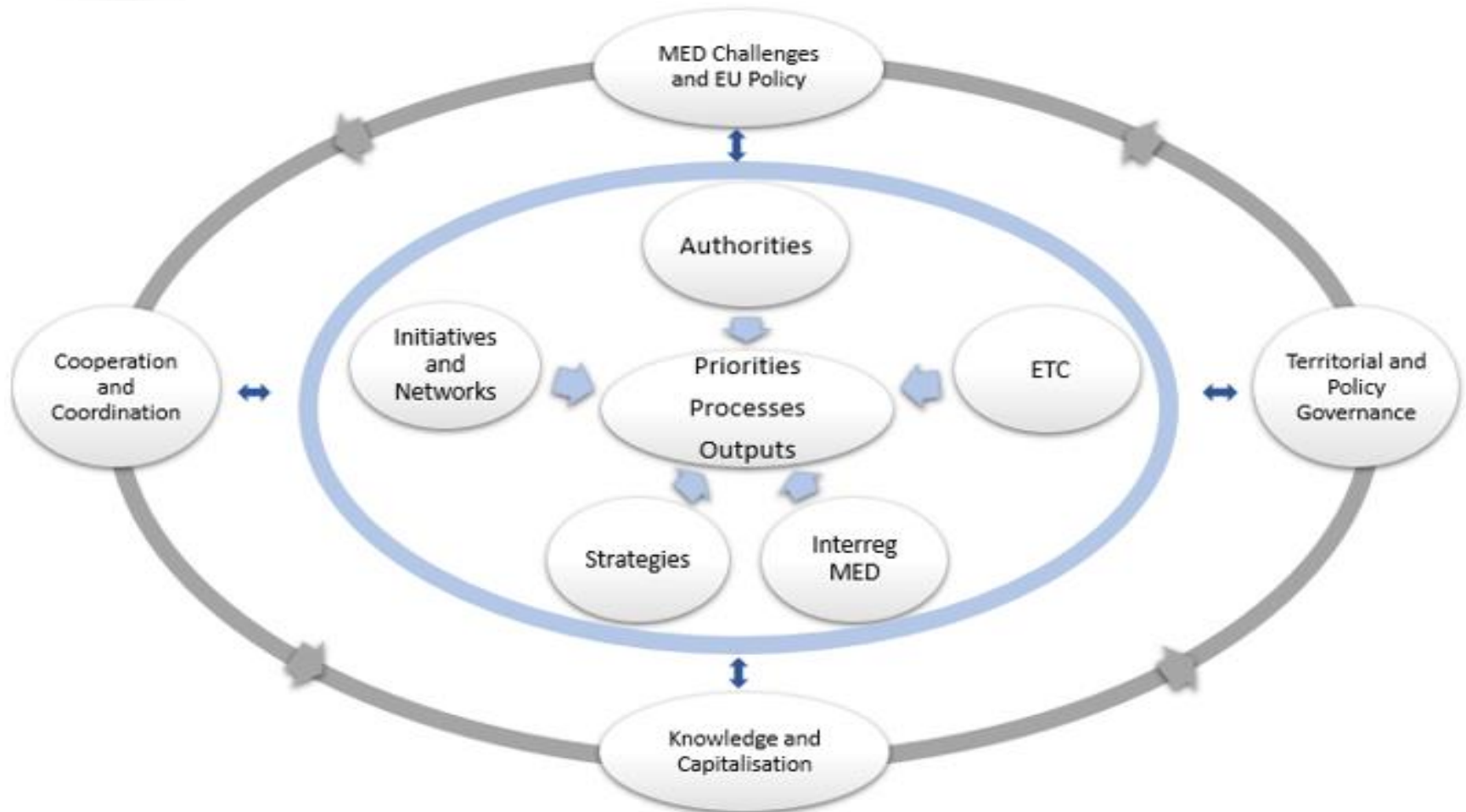
□ *Bring forward the vision to a more unified region.*

Hence, a Mediterranean Cooperation Governance System (MCGS) should be firstly conceptualized in order to make cooperation more operational and enhance its ability to set the scene for a more integrated framework with tangible and measurable results...

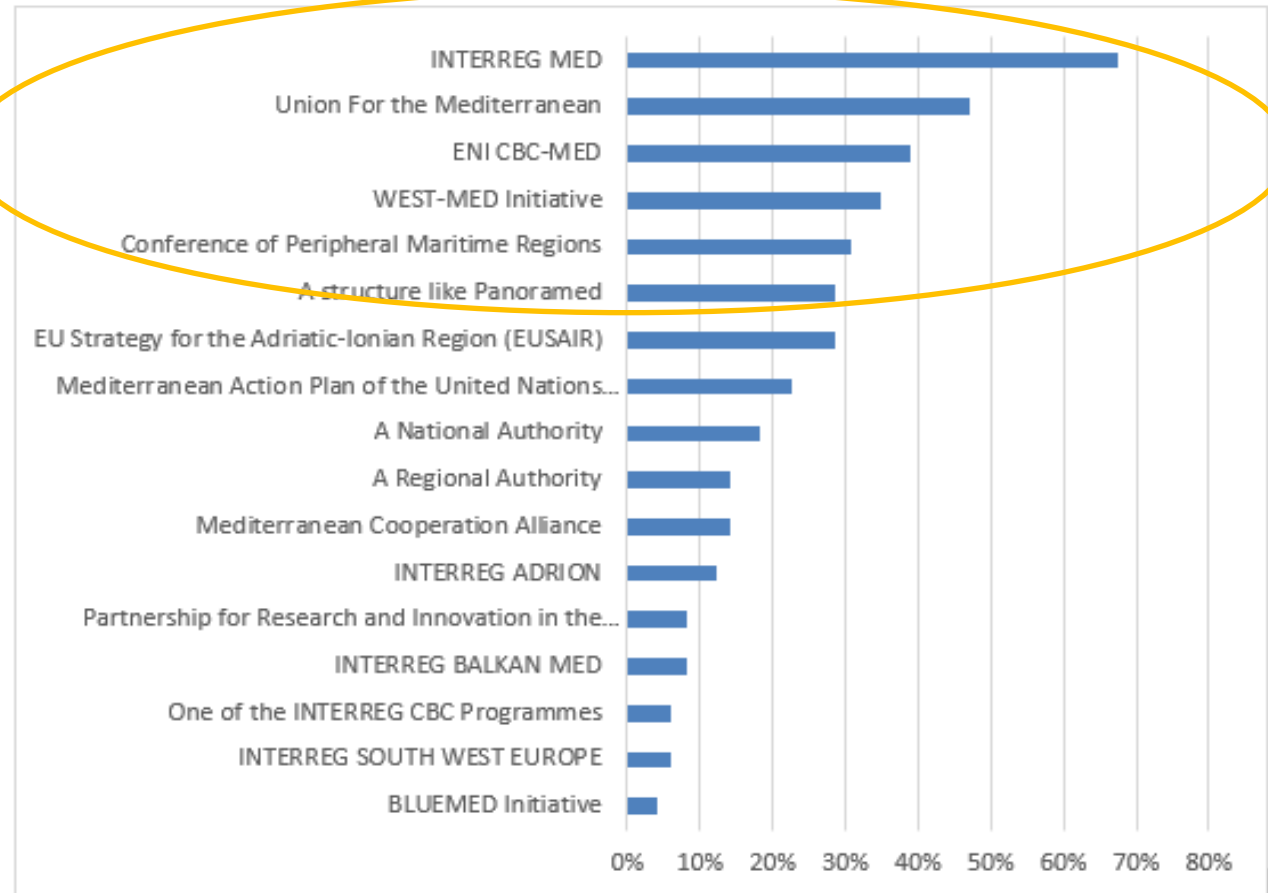

Building the dialogue

- Agreement on key issues of the dialogue
- Agreement on roles and responsibilities
- Agreement on the activities of actors to be considered as actual contributions to the MCGS
- Agreement on the sectors and fields to be included in the MCGS
- Define, Set up the monitoring structure & processes
- Develop clearly identified and contextualized, SMART indicators
- Develop an action plan on data collection & storage methods
- Risk Analysis
- Create a dialogue platform, link it with the layers of the MCGS
- Link the platform to the monitoring system
- Define and make known the methods for setting priorities

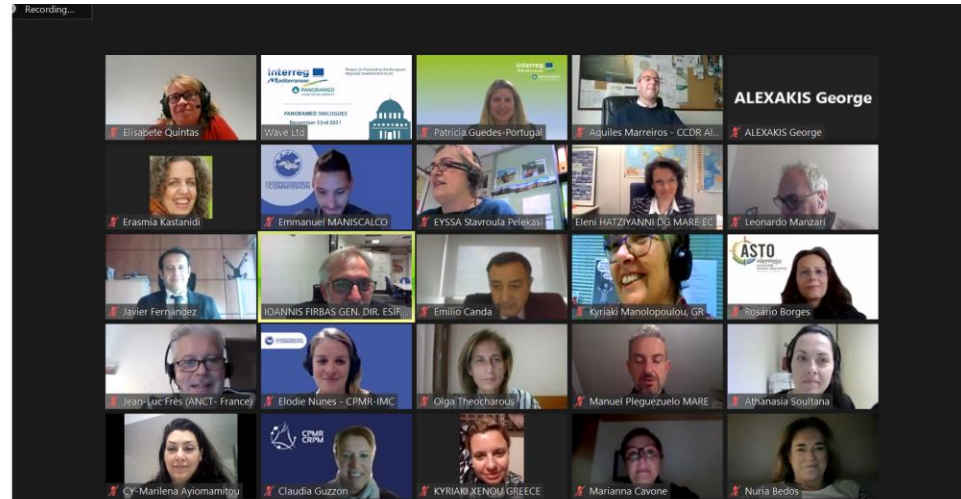
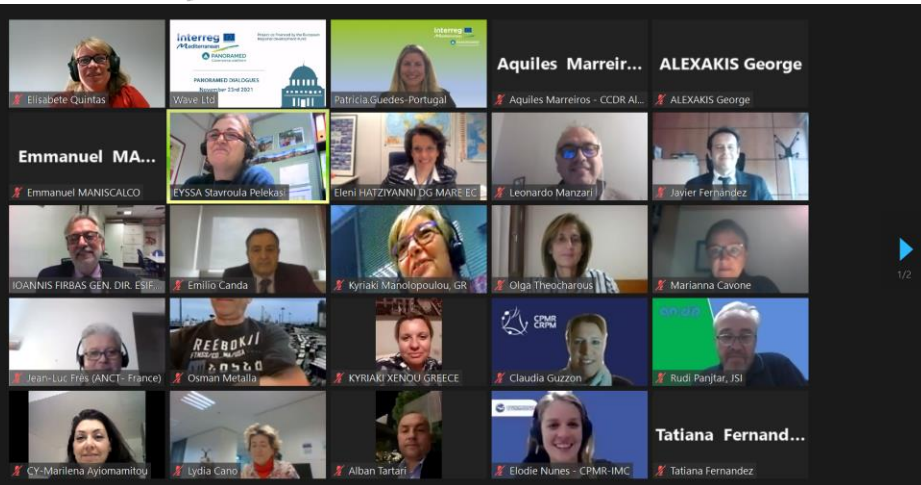
